According to the Fix the Fells website: "Since 2002 skilled footpath repair teams and volunteers have been using both traditional and cutting edge techniques to maintain and repair the Lake District's upland footpaths. There are now 344 paths totalling 661 km or 410 miles identified for repair work, maintenance, or monitoring."

The Burn How has been supporting conservation in the Lake District for many years and have raised over £32,000 to conservation projects across the Lake District.
